Proposed changes to the Constitution of the NEOHIO Region, Inc. of the Sports Car Club of America

Following are the proposed changes to the Constitution of the NEOHIO Region, Inc. of the Sports Car Club of America. Some changes are correcting typographical errors in the Constitution as posted on the NEOHIO Region website. Some are addressing an ambiguous term ("membership at large") used several times in the Constitution. The last proposed change is to allow some flexibility in the date of the Annual Meeting. Currently, the Constitution requires the annual meeting to take place on the third Tuesday of November. This often causes conflicts with Thanksgiving. The Board has been asked several times to change the date of the meeting, but we are barred by the Constitution from doing so. This change would allow the Board to select an alternate date.

Proposed Changes:

Correct the typo in Article IV, paragraph 4, item e), third bullet point (describing the duties of the Treasurer):

Existing:

Checks drawn again the Region's accounts must be signed by two officers.

Change to:

Checks drawn against the Region's accounts must be signed by two officers.

Article VIII, paragraph 1; Article X (two occasions), and Article XI:

Replace the phrase "membership (or members) at large" with "membership" or "members" as appropriate.

Article VI, paragraph 1. Annual Meeting:

Exiting:

An annual meeting will take place on the third Tuesday of November each year. The Board of Trustees will determine where and at what time the meeting will occur.

Change to:

An annual meeting will take place in November of each year. The Board of Trustees will determine the date, time, and place of the meeting.

Trans Am at Mid-Ohio:

Francis, Jr., Boden, and Funk take victory in Saturday's First Energy Mid-Ohio 100

LEXINGTON, Ohio (10 August 2019) – The FirstEnergy Mid-Ohio 100, featuring the Trans Am Series presented by Pirelli's Trans Am, SuperGT and GT classes, saw a dogfight at the front of the field for the entire 43-lap race Saturday at the Mid-Ohio Sports Car Course.

In the end Ernie Francis Jr. managed to keep Chris Dyson in his rearview mirror to capture his third victory of the season. In the SGT class, Mark Boden took the green flag from pole and never looked back, opening a lead of over 23 seconds over second place Ken Thwaits before the race-ending yellow came out.

Twenty-one entries took the green flag in the TA/SGT/GT event, held in conjunction with the NASCAR Xfinity Series event at Mid-Ohio. The first race on the Saturday card, the teams dealt with dramatically different weather circumstances than they had earlier in the weekend, with cloudy and cool conditions for the early-morning event. The field included a late entry - sports car legend Boris Said, making his 2019 series debut in the No. 2 SRI Performance Dodge Challenger that had arrived at Mid-Ohio late Friday.

Pole sitter Ernie Francis Jr. started his No. 98 Frameless Shower Doors Ford Mustang in the TA and overall pole position, looking to repeat his Mid-Ohio win of 2018. But Chris Dyson, winner of two straight TA class races and driving the retroliveried No. 20 Thetford/Norcold

Ford Mustang, would not allow Francis Jr. a moment of comfort on the tight, twisty and technical 13-turn, 2.258-mile Mid-Ohio circuit.

The duo fought hard throughout the race, with Francis Jr. able to post a three-second lead early, but Dyson came back mid-race with a succession of quick race laps as the pair separated from the rest of the field. Doug Peterson – pulling double duty this weekend in both TA and his regular TA2 drive – tried valiantly to stay in the fight but headed for pit lane on Lap 10 with a mechanical issue, handing third position to Adam Andretti in the No. 17 Engineered Components Co./Anchor Bold Chevrolet Corvette.

On Lap 39, the GT class entry of Larry Funk (No. 64 Business Advisory Services Ford Mustang) went wide out of Turn 9 and hard into the barrier in Turn 10, leaving a significant debris field that could not be cleaned before the



race end, with the checkered flag waving at the 65-minute mark. Ohio natives Amy Ruman and David Pintaric finished fourth and fifth, respectively. Said seemed poised for a charge through the field, climbing as high as fourth before mechanical issues placed him back in the field with a 13th place finish.

"I was pretty excited to see if we would get back to green flag racing," said Francis Jr. "It would have been an awesome shoot out to the end.(Chris) Dyson and I were very close in our lap times. The lapped traffic held us up at the end. We had a really great race and

our Ford Mustang was awesome. I can't thank everyone at Breathless enough, we were fasted in just about every session. The car was flawless all weekend, I'm happy about this win and it's good for us in the points. I can't wait to take it to Road America."

"We had a bit of too much understeer, so I was a little too conservative, "said Dyson, who set a new race record lap at 1:21.923 on Lap 34). "I thought I was going to give Ernie a good run there to the end since we were back and forth all weekend. We were so close and I think that is how this championship is shaping up. We will be neck and neck the entire

time. We had a great car and we were quick all weekend. We can't wait to get to Road America now."

Meanwhile, the SGT race was a tale of dominance by Mark Boden in the No. 46 Beverage Flavors International Porsche 991 GT3 Cup, who held a sizable lead over Ken Thwaits in the No. 35 WilwoodBrakes/FranklinRdApparel Audi R8 LMS. Neither Thwaits nor No. 44 Lemons of Love Porsche 991 GT3 Cup car driver Tim Kezman could post a charge at Boden, who captured his second win of the season.

"The car was absolutely on rails today," said Boden. "The conditions to start the race were perfect. There are a few tricks to this place when the track is right. You have to focus on what you are doing and not what is going on behind. I love racing here - it's one of my favorite tracks! The car was perfect to push as hard as I could to come home with championship points."

Ernie Francis Jr. also takes home the Trans Am COOLSHIRT Systems Cool Move of the Race.

How racing and the SCCA helped save the Corvette

The reveal of the 2020 Corvette Stingray took place in Hanger No. 2 at the former Marine Corps Air Station in Tustin, CA, on July 18. But as I sat there with some 1,400 event attendees taking in the spectacular pomp and circumstance prior to the car's unveiling, I became distracted by the mention of one specific person who impacted this program over the years: Zora Arkus-Duntov.

Even if you are only vaguely familiar with Corvette history, you've likely heard of Duntov, as General Motors credits him with saving the Corvette from an early demise. Duntov joined GM in 1953, shortly after seeing the first Corvette at the New York Motorama, and was faced with the reality that the roadster was falling short in regard to its impact on the industry and the car's performance; in a nutshell, the Corvette was struggling to draw buyers. Even as the Corvette got its first V8 in 1955 (at the urging of Duntov), it still trailed behind the new Ford Thunderbird in sales.

Duntov knew he had to make a name for the Corvette, and the best way to do that was at the racetrack. To that end, Le Mans, 12 Hours of Sebring, and SCCA races were the playgrounds Duntov chose to showcase the car that has since become an American icon. The first taste of SCCA racing success for Duntov's program came at the hands of SCCA Hall of Fame member Dr. Dick Thompson, when Thompson won the 1956 C Production title. This was the first of many SCCA titles for the car.

Racer magazine writer Jason Isley, SCCA competitor and BOD member,
witnessed the unveiling and shared his thoughts pertaining to the role
SCCA played in the iconic sports car's development and history.

In 1957, John Fitch (2005 SCCA Hall of Fame member) and Piero Taruffi drove the Corvette to a class win at the 12 Hours of Sebring.

Even as the Automobile Manufacturer's Association (AMA) put a ban on factory-supported racing programs, Duntov made sure the cars were still on track by supplying "privateer" teams with cars. Briggs Cunningham (2010 SCCA Hall of Fame inductee) fielded three cars at Le Mans in 1960, with the entry driven by Fitch and Bob Grossman, taking the big-bore GT class win and finishing eighth overall.

In 1963, GM was feeling the pressure of the AMA ban and took measures to enforce it within its own ranks, but Duntov would not be deterred. Duntov placed the Grand Sport Corvettes, which were manufactured specifically for racing prior to GM shuttering the program, into some very capable hands. To that end, Roger Penske (2016 SCCA Hall of Fame member), A.J. Foyt, Jim Hall (2012 SCCA Hall of Fame member) and Thompson

all logged time behind the wheel of those Grand Sport Corvettes.

Through the generations, Corvette has earned a prominent place in racing, from the pro ranks of IMSA and Trans Am, to club racing and autocross. It's very likely that without racing — and Duntov's early influence — the C8 Corvette would not exist.

Always striving to push the engineering envelope, Duntov began development of a midengine Corvette in the late 1960s. Internal battles within GM. Duntov's prevented however, vision from seeing production as at that time, the Corvette was selling well and the cost for his radical redesign was deemed too costly.

Back in the hangar in July 2019, as the curtain lifted and a C8 drove upon the stage for all to see, my focus finally returned to present. And there it was, Duntov's vision of a mid-engine Corvette brought to life. But unlike his previous prototypes, this one will finally make it into the hands of consumers.
