Al was winner of the 1988 SCCA D Sports Racing National Championship and the President's Cup for the top drive at the National Championship Runoffs – at age 62! He was one of the Club's top D Sports Racing drivers behind the wheel of a Bobsy and Bease-Decker ...winner of multiple SCCA divisional championships and the National C Sports Racing National title in 1986.

Al was also the Neohio Driver of the year in 1974, 1978, 1979, 1986, and 1988; and recipient of the Betty & Roxy Kincaid for Sportsmanship in 1980 and 1998.

2019 Hall of Fame Inductees

The Neohio Hall of Fame will induct two new members at our annual awards banquet on February 16, 2019 – Catherine (Cat) Kizer and Sam Oram.

Cat Kizer

As a NEOhio Region member since 1976, Cat Kizer is the only woman in the history of SCCA, awarded the highest honor given to Club Racing drivers, the President's Cup. Cat is proud to share this honor with the likes of Dave Weitzenhof, Al Beasley Sr., Roger Penske, Bobby Rahall, Paul Newman and a host of other big names.

In 1979, her second year in National competition, Cat drove the #2 Red Roof Inns MG Midget to four H Production wins in six starts to qualify for the Runoffs as the Central Division H Production Champion. Recognition along the way, among other things, included being the first woman to win a race and set a class lap record at Mid-Ohio.

The HP field at the Runoffs was formidable, including four drivers that cumulatively held six national championship victories at that time. Starting from eighth on the grid, Cat made an inspiring charge through the field to take the lead on lap four. Giving up the lead only briefly a few times, Cat beat two time champ Randy Canfield to the checker by just 0.162 seconds to become the first woman to win a Runoffs National Championship, an accomplishment subsequently equaled by only one other woman to date.

To show it was no fluke, Cat returned to the Runoffs the

following year in 1980, captured the pole, and finished on the podium in 3^{rd} .

Cat's other accomplishments include a share of the victory with the winning Fred Baker team at the 1981 Longest Day, becoming the first woman driver to participate in an overall win there.

Cat went on to be a factory driver for Renault Racing where she contributed to Renault winning the manufacturer's championship in the IMSA RS series. Later, she drove for Volkswagen of America, also in the IMSA RS series, before retiring from competition.

Although the Kizers have lived in Oregon since 1991, they've remained loyal NEOhio Region members.

Sam Oram, a long standing member of the Neohio Region, is best remembered in the flagging

community. He began corner working at Nelson Ledges where his daughter Tara "Toe" Oram recalls staying with her mom in the camping area while dad was on the corner. Eventually Sam became Chief of Flagging for the region. He was also part of Lake Erie Communication providing service at Mid Ohio & Nelson Ledges. After LEC leader Bill Benham passed away, Sam became its Director in the late 1970's and led the organization for nearly 20 years. Sam was partially responsible for keeping LEC intact when Les Griebling, owner of Mid-Ohio at the time, considered starting his own Mid-Ohio flaggers group. Sam's dedication to LEC was responsible for the long lasting run it has enjoyed after the original founders died or moved on to other endeavors.

Sam was also a Neohio Trustee; Competition Board member and ultimately the RE in 1990 & 1991.

Nelson Council Resurrected As Nelson Ledges Continues Revival

Neohio Region SCCA members have expressed a lot of interest in the activities at Nelson Ledges Road Course since it was acquired by new ownership in early 2016. The new owners have demonstrated a commitment to improving the facility to a significantly higher standard than the reputation it was remembered for in the last few years of the original ownership.

To date, the track has been completely repayed following the traditional two mile course that many of us remember. Concrete curbing has been added at the apexes and the track is now smooth and fast. The older and more decrepit buildings have been torn down and the debris removed from the facility. The Timing and Scoring tower and the Tech Shed remain and are being used regularly. There is now a new building in the infield shortly after you cross the bridge that crosses the front straight at Pit Out.

This is just the beginning of an extensive plan that the new owners have embarked on to resurrect Nelson Ledges to the fun and enjoyable home for motorsports that many of us remember. As the team working at the track is currently small and the "to-do list" is large, efficiency is critical.

In an effort to respect ownership wishes and streamline the communication channel between track management and SCCA, the Neohio Region Trustees voted to resurrect the Nelson Council and delegate the Council as the primary point of contact to the track. In the weeks since this vote has taken place, I have been in contact with representatives from Mahoning Valley, Misery Bay, Steel Cities, Western New York and Finger Lakes Regions. Every region contacted was excited at the idea of Nelson Ledges coming back on-line as a competitive SCCA venue. All expressed interest and willingness to support SCCA events that come up in the future.

Mahoning Valley, as our sister region who traditionally put on regular events at the track, is especially interested in working to build a long term relationship with the track and agrees with the designation of the Nelson Council as the primary communication channel going forward. Brian Vondran, MVR Regional Executive and I have been carrying on frequent conversations to assure that we are aligned and can represent SCCA in the most positive light with track management.

As you will see elsewhere in this issue of the *Blower*, we are working diligently to lock in a date for an SCCA Time Trial event to take place at Nelson Ledges this summer. We hope that everyone reading this will come and participate and invite your friends. We think this will be a great, competitive event that will reflect well on SCCA and contribute to building a long term relationship with the track.

In the meantime, in the interest of freeing up the team at Nelson Ledges so they can focus on their plans for enhancing the facility, we

Time Trials Coming to Tracks Near Us

Time Trials are SCCA's newest form of motorsports competition! Time Trials are events in which competitors vie for the fastest lap or elapsed time to complete a designated course. Time Trials competitors may share the track, but these events are not wheel-to-wheel competitions. In this area, the events will be run on local race tracks.

SCCA Time Trials are open to most four-wheeled vehicles that pass the safety inspection. There are four categories that are based on the level of preparation for a car. The Sport Category is for street vehicles that can have some minor modifications. The Tuner Category allows builders to develop a car as far as possible without changing the core DNA of the car. The Max Category is the maximum allowable modification for a vehicle that can still be driven on the street. Finally, the Unlimited Category is just that, full blown competition cars with no consideration for being street legal. Advanced safety equipment such as roll bars or cages is allowed in all categories, but only required in Unlimited.

This provides competitors the opportunity to compete on a race track in their Solo car, in their souped up street car or in their full built race car. There are two formats to the competition and both formats can be included in an event. The TrackSprint format is very much like an Autocross on a race track. The start and finish lines are set such that the run is slightly less than a full lap. Cars are dispatched on track from a standing start with enough time between starts that catching the car in front of you should not be an issue. Scoring is based on the shortest time to complete the course.

The Time Attack format runs more like a qualifying session in a race weekend. Competitors will complete several laps within a timed session. Run groups are based on track experience and passing rules are set per group based on driver's experience. Passing for the least experienced group is limited to straightaways much like a PDX. Passing for the most experienced group can take place anywhere on track, although a point-by is to be used when passing in corners. Scoring is based on best lap time.

Time Trials appear to be a great opportunity for anyone interested in driving fast. Non-members

can participate on a weekend membership. Licensing is based on experience and drivers with no previous experience can get a Novice License as long as they have a valid driver's license. Any competition license that is listed in the SCCA GCR is acceptable.

Currently there is a National Time Trial event scheduled at PittRace on the weekend of April 27th. Nelson Council is also in the process of booking an event at Nelson Ledges the weekend of June 29th. This is a great opportunity to get all of our racers to bring their cars out and experience the new pavement as well as giving our Solo competitors an opportunity to run on a full race track in their Solo vehicles. Please watch for more information on this event in coming issues of the *Blower*.
