Information for Area 4 Members

Dear Area 4 Members,

It has been another busy month. It started with the December BOD meeting at the PRI show in Orlando; no time for relaxation there as the schedule was full of action items. Here is Newsletter Number 8 with more of the details:

The "Majors"

The Majors schedule was presented at the PRI Show. I was surprised, like many of you, to see the race at Gateway listed as one of the Northern Conference points events. In discussions with Butch and Terry, they needed one more event to round out the Northern schedule. And since CenDiv will only have a single race at the June Sprints as part of the Majors (Great Lakes Division will have three Double race weekends), they needed one more event to complete the schedule. In reality, I don't think Gateway will impact us at all. I see most of the CenDiv racers joining us at Mid-Ohio, Michigan International Speedway, and GingerMan Raceway rather than haul down to Gateway. We expected some anomalies in 2013 as National racing transitions to the Majors. By 2014, things should settle in.

GT-2

By now, the new GT-2 specifications will have been published. This was a well thought out and comprehensive document presented to the BOD by the CRB to incorporate more cars into this class. While I agreed with almost everything in this plan, there was a restrictor plate specification that was directed at the Sunbeam Tiger that looked suspect. A call to Sunbeam Tiger racers in GLD confirmed this part of the GT-2 plan would not benefit our members and I voted against it. Although the GT-2 Plan passed the BOD, I have asked the CRB to look at the Sunbeam

specification line again. They will. Just a reminder, as your Director, I represent you. If you have issue with anything the club is doing, my door is open to help you.

Insurance

You will see a Press Release in the next day or so, detailing the impact of the new SCCA Insurance Package. We have been successful in reducing while maintaining costs better coverage than any of our competitors. The new rates will save our Regions per event from \$1000 (75 car event) to \$2800 (300 car event). The savings will not be just for road racing, but will apply for all of our speed events. And, the fees will not be due until 14 days after the event, thus helping the Region's cash flow. The insurance committee was made up of SCCA members who had a strong background in the insurance industry. As such, they knew how to go to market and obtain the best value. Engaging the expertise among our membership was a smart play, and will be used again in the future.

SportsCar Magazine

As you have noticed with your January issue, the look and feel of Sportscar has changed. Paul Pfanner is now the Publisher. His company also publishes *Racer* magazine. We are in the last year of our contract with Pfanner. They proposed some changes to the magazine back in October and the BOD asked if they would make some of these changes now so we could gauge member reaction. Let us know what you think. Negotiations with Pfanner are ongoing, but we are also looking at all our options.

New SCCA Officers

The BOD has elected Lisa Noble to be the new Chairman of the Board for 2013. She replaces Jerry Wannarka who did a terrific job for the club, but did not seek re-election. Dick Patullo was elected Vice Chairman. Lisa and Dick are excellent choices to lead the club. Both are experienced, smart and dedicated.

I will again be part of the Planning Committee and the Compensation Committee and the liaison to the RallyCross Board. It should be a very good 2013.

Strategic Plan (STRAP)

This is developing nicely. We have already accomplished some of the initial STAP items. That is the beauty of using this type of short to medium term working document. New items have been added. You will see this material presented at the National Convention.

Michigan International Speedway

There are a couple of small items to complete at MIS before we get our final approval from the SCCA national office. We do not anticipate any problems. The folks at MIS have been wonderful to work with and we look forward to our Majors Double there over Memorial weekend in 2013. Thanks again to all who made this possible - Verne Wandell, Dan and Tara Hodge, Andy and Sue Welden, Terry and Ed Ozment, Dayle Frame and, of course, the members of the Western Michigan Region.

Bluegrass Motorsports Park

We are talking every week with the owners and others who want the SCCA to join them in a consortium of owners. All I can say is that there is progress.

Ohio Winter Rally 2013 - Saturday, February 2nd

This year's Ohio Winter Rally is on Saturday, February 2. The rally is the second round of the 2013 SCCA Great Lakes Division Rally Championship and counts toward the SCCA National Touring Rally Championship (Regional Rally).

The route will take competitors over approximately 130 miles of rural roads in the Lake Erie "snowbelt" counties of northeast Ohio. The rally difficulty will be dictated by prevailing road and weather conditions. Competitors should come prepared to spend extended periods of time outside in severe winter conditions.

Competitors can expect an absolutely straightforward, gimmick-free time-speed-distance (TSD) road rally. Emphasis will be on precise timing at well-placed controls. A columnar "tulip" route instruction format including official mileages for all action points will be used. Redundant, clarifying instructions will be included anywhere that there is any question of route-following ambiguity.

Hall of Fame Features Legends Barber, Noble, Rahal, Shelby & Porterfield

Road Racing legends Skip Barber, Bill Noble, Bobby Rahal, Carroll Shelby, and Andy Porterfield compose the 2013 SCCA Hall of Fame Class for significant contributions to motorsports and the Sports Car Club of America. The newly-selected class will take their positions amongst the giants of the Club during an induction ceremony at the SCCA National Convention on Saturday, March 2, 2013 in Las Vegas.

The SCCA National Hall of Fame was created in 2004 to preserve, protect and record the history and accomplishments of the Club by acknowledging those members who have made a significant impact on the development of SCCA, be it through service to the national achievements organization, national competition, bringing national recognition to SCCA, or a combination of these factors. Nominations were submitted to and reviewed by the Hall of Fame Nomination and Selection Committees before the inductees were selected.

"Skip" Barber has Iohn seen thousands of SCCA Racers pass through the driving school that he started and bears his name to this day. His career and contributions to the SCCA go well beyond his role as an instructor. Mr. Barber won the Formula Ford (now Formula F) National Championship in back-toback years at the Runoffs, winning in 1969 and 1970. The 1970 title was paired with another championship in Formula B – a class that became Formula Atlantic – to earn him that season's President's Cup. Barber reached the pinnacle as a driver with a handful of races in Formula One. and remains President and Owner of Lime Rock Park to this day. Barber has been an SCCA member for 54 William **James** "Bill" Noble became one of the most successful Championship-winning drivers in SCCA history and had a hand in many more. A renowned engine builder and five-time National Champion in one of Club Racing's most competitive class, his "Engines by Noble" have captured an incredible 25 National Championships in the 49-year history of the Runoffs. Noble was awarded the Road Racing Driver's Club Mark Donohue Award in 1989, and the Kansas Region presents the Bill Noble Award to the driver who best exemplifies the combination of mechanical expertise, driving skill, and competitive sportsmanship that were Noble's traits. To display that sportsmanship, Noble had a longstanding offer to engine customers: anytime a customer wanted to trade their engine for the one in Noble's car, he would not only take them up on it, but help them install the engine. Noble passed away in 2011 at the age of 69. His business and racing legacy are continued by his widow, SCCA Chairman Lisa Noble.

Andrew Tracy "Andy" Poterfield is inducted for his years of contributions to the Club, both as a driver and behind the scenes. Porterfield, known as a Corvette racer, won the 1978 and 1979 National Championships in B Production, and was Southern Pacific Division Champion an unprecedented 23 times. A regular racer in SCCA Trans-Am races, Porterfield served on the Cal Club Region Board for 16 years, including as Region Executive for five years. He served on the SCCA Board of Directors, and was selected as the Chairman of the Board of SCCA Enterprises, where he continued to help grow and maintain the subsidiary until his death. Porterfield also organized the corner workers in the early days of the Long Beach Grand Prix. A winner of the 2008 John McGill Award for contributions to Club Racing and the Woolf Barnato Award in 2009 for outstanding long-term contribution to the SCCA, Porterfield's SCCA credentials are unquestioned. Porterfield passed away in April 2012, but will continue to influence SCCA racers through his Porterfield Brakes, a company he founded in 1986.

Robert Woodward "Bobby" Rahal, has had a long and distinguished motorsports career that began in the Sports Car Club of America. As a 22-year-old, Rahal was awarded the President's Cup following his 1975 Formula B (soon to be renamed Formula Atlantic) National Championship. Using Club Racing as a springboard, Rahal went on to drive IMSA and in the SCCA Trans-Am Series before becoming a champion open-wheel driver. The 1986 Indianapolis 500 winner won CART Championships in 1986, 1987, and 1992, as well as the series' Rookie of the Year award in 1982. Rahal is the current co-owner of Rahal Letterman Lanigan Racing, where they've recently hired 2005 SCCA National Champion Graham Rahal (son of the newest Hall of Famer) to drive in the IndyCar Series.

Carroll Shelby's impact on the SCCA will last long into the future, even if you ignore the mark he made as a driver that won an SCCA National Championship in 1956 (Formula Libre). Though Shelby competed in eight Formula One races and won the 24 Hours of LeMans behind the wheel, his legacy is, obviously, as the man who practically invented the American iron pony car. In 49 SCCA National Championship Runoffs, 35 drivers have left with the



Beyond Club Racing, the GT 350 was also the inaugural Trans-Am Series manufacturer champion. Shelby passed away in May 2012 at the age of 89.
