SCCA NeOhio Region presents the...

50th Anniversary Ohio Winter Rally - Saturday, 2/6/2016

This year's Ohio Winter Rally is on Saturday, February 6. The rally is the second round of the 2016 SCCA Great Lakes Division Rally Championship and counts toward the SCCA National Touring Rally Championship (Divisional Rally).

The "OWR" was first organized in 1966 by the MG Car Club, Lake Erie Centre, in cooperation with the Marshall Mustang Owners' Club. It was a standard feature on the MGCC's annual competition calendar through the 1980's, before finding its current home with Neohio Region, SCCA. It was a qualifying event through the entire history of the long-lamented Ohio Rally Championship (ORC) series.

The route will take competitors over approximately 160 miles of rural roads in the Lake Erie "snowbelt" counties of northeast Ohio. The rally difficulty will be dictated by prevailing road and weather conditions. Competitors should come prepared to spend extended periods of time outside in severe winter conditions.

This year we plan to visit several of the sites of past incidents that have contributed to the lore of the OWR. The routebook will be annotated with brief synopses of these foibles, and hopefully several of their perpertrators will appear to be honored in person.

Competitors can expect an absolutely straightforward, gimmick-free timespeed-distance (TSD) road rally. Emphasis will be on precise timing at wellplaced controls. A columnar "tulip" route instruction format is used. Redundant, clarifying instructions are included anywhere that there is any question of route-following ambiguity.

- E Equipment unrestricted
- L Odometer unrestricted. Calculating device restricted only in that it may not be integrated with odometer and clock.
- S Unmodified stock and/or GPS odometer (s) only. Calculating device restricted only in that it may not be integrated with the odometer and clock.
- Novice Class S entry in which neither team member has entered more than 5 TSD rallies previously (simultaneously entered in Class S for championship purposes).

Author's passion for vintage cars starts at island raceway

Russell resident Carl Goodwin was 15 years old when he was introduced to sports car racing at Put-in-Bay Village on South Bass Island in Lake Erie. It sparked his enthusiasm for sports car racing that has also resulted in two books, with the latest being "The Put-in-Bay Road Races" covering the history of the races from 1952 to 1963.

Mr. Goodwin recalled when he was a teen living in Shaker Heights, a friend invited him to see car racing.

"I asked 'What are those?' My interest at the time was in nature and the outdoors."

His father, Ray Goodwin, drove him and three friends to the raceway.

"We went up to Port Clinton and got on a ferry boat. We could hear the cars' racing engines," he said as they approached the dock at the island. "We were hooked," he said.

At the time, there weren't many places to race sports cars in the area.

Mr. Goodwin's book is filled with more than 200 photos from the time that the races flourished at the Lake Erie island. He searched for photos at the Bowling Green State University photo archives and other sources for the book.

There are stories about those who drove their own race cars, as well as stories about the picturesque town.

He tells of the history of the races and how they were first organized by Dick and Betty Henn of the Cleveland Sports Car Club. Helmets and seat belts were the only safety requirements in those early years. It wasn't until 1958 that rollover bars were added to protect the drivers.

Racers went over on the ferry with their cars. It ignited a love for small

sports cars in many people, he said, who couldn't resist admiring Triumphs, Morgans, the AC Bristol, the Porsche, the Siata and the Alfa Romeo.

"The cars were those driven by the racers for daily transportation, often to work, and they loved those cars,: he said. They were not professional racers, but car salesmen, stock brokers, engineers and others with regular jobs. There were no sponsors or prize money in those days, just a love of fast cars.

The question of safety did arise, with cars going 130 mph on the 3.1 mile rectangular course. Spectators were separated from the speeding cars only by snow fences and hay bails. If a car went off the course or got out of control it could be a catastrophe, he said. Even so, the safety record was very good at Put-in-Bay, Mr. Goodwin noted.

Racing a the island eventually did end as tracks were opened in other areas.

Now the only racing there involves sailing regattas around the harbor.

"The bay is so appealing, and I got interested in boats as well," he said. He was determined to get a sports car and in 1958, while in college, he acquired a Siata. "I worked on it and I really liked that car a lot. I drove it around and took it to a field trial in the Youngstown area."

He raced from 1960 to 1961 in a Fiat Abarth Zagato and from 1996 to 1998 with an Alexis Formula Ford accompanied by his wife, Nancy. Eventually, however, he shifted to sailing "because it was cheaper than racing cars. You don't have to rebuild the engines and tires."

He participated in races in Connecticut, New Jersey and Illinois. "I had a Karmann Ghia as well after the Abarth." His other cars included a Porsche 912 that he and his wife took on vacation to Northern Europe and

into the Soviet Union in 1965. They went to Sweden, Finland and Norway in the car, he noted.

He always kept in touch with the sports cars scene and is a member of the Sports Car Club of America, Northeast Ohio Region.

He currently is working on a Lotus 22 Formula Jr. which is a single-seat open wheel racing car. Mr. Goodwin raced a similar car, an Alexis 18B Formula Ford, for three years in the late 1990s.

Mr. Goodwin worked in the advertising business for 43 years. He was a creative director at Kenyon & Eckhardt in Detroit where he and his family lived for 22 years.

Before this book, he wrote "They Started in MGs," which profiles 80 early sports car racers. He has written for several automobile magazines including the Vintage Motorsport,

racing, such as Los Angeles' Peterson Automotive Museum currently displaying "Howlin': Select Vehicles from the Nearburg Collection."

If you don't want to travel that far, we have our very own Crawford Auto-Aviation Museum. The oldest car in the collection is an 1895 Panhard et Levassor, while the most modern is the robotic car named "DEXTER", which was team Team Case's entry in 2007 DARPA Urban Challenge 2007, in which it placed in the top 20 entries. As of 2011, the museum Vintage Racecar, 356 Register, Classic MG and Forza, as well as the website Veloce Today, about Italian cars.

Mr. Goodwin won awards for his magazine articles and his first book. His book on the Put-in-Bay races won an International Automotive Media Silver Award this year. He is already working on a third book on sports cars.

More and more people are getting into vintage racing. "I see the sport of racing the old care growing. It's a lot of fun and exciting and interesting." Most importantly, he emphasized, "It's a wonderful sport, full of wonderful people. They're competitive, but such nice people. And winning isn't as important as the doing."

New Year always bring racing news and 2016 is no exception. Formula One will look a lot different with Sebastian Vettel moving to the Prancing Horse of Ferrari and Fernando Alonso going to McLaren as it gains Honda power. The very front of the grid will probably look the same with Champion Lewis Hamilton and runner up Nico Rosberg returning in the all dominating Silver Arrows Mercedes Team. At the rear, the Marussia and Caterham Teams are gone.

Ford fans of the Tudor Sports Car Series will see Ganassi Racing gain Ford as its primary sponsor and former BMW factory driver Joey Hand joining Scott Pruitt in an Eco Boost Daytona Prototype. But the biggest Ford news is the confirmation of a new Ford super car (Ford GT?) to be developed for the GTLM class to contest Le Mans in 2016. The 50th anniversary of the Ford GT one, two, three finish at the Circuit Permanente de la Sarthe is next year. Coincidence? I think not. Ohio team Michael Shank racing has dropped Ford Power for Honda for the New Year. Sadly, the defending champion Dodge Viper GTLM machines will not return.

The New Year sees the Pirelli World Challenge Series running separate races for the GTS class. Former Tudor team Bob Stallings Racing moves to the series fielding a GTS class Hyundai Genesis Coupe for longtime driver Jon Fogarty. Another PWC acquisition is Flying Lizard who joins with K-Pax Racing to field two McLaren 650s GT3 machines in GT.

Local driver Amy Ruman ended the Trans Am season with an historic win at Daytona and hopes to move up two spots from her third place series finish.

The Kryderacing Corvette of David Pintaric will continue to push her. Aaron Quine will tackle the full Trans Am season in TA2 as he moves from a successful debut in a Mustang back to his Chevy roots with a Hugger Orange Howe Camaro.

2015 sees what is probably the fewest number ever of SCCA races schedules at Nelson Ledges with one regional the first weekend in May and one in June. The World Racing League, an amateur endurance series that features SCCA

as the \$500 machines, takes the July 11 and 12 date. Hopefully, the improvements at the track will continue.
