Nelson Ledges Announcement

Neohio has made numerous attempts since October to communicate and secure a contract with Nelson Ledges management and owners for our Double Regional on May 2-3. On March 1 we finally received a contract for the Board to approve. The contract existed of 24 pages compared to previous ones with the track of four pages. Extensive review was done by the Board prior to our meeting on March 4.

The timing of this contract was 10 days prior to us having to have our entry completed and approved by the Neohio Board, submitted to Divisional Stewards for review and approval, and submission to National office with our sanction request and fees to not incur late fees. Also this would leave us less than a two months to promote the event.

The Board after reviewing the contract voted unanimously to reject the contract as it was not in the best interest of Neohio and its membership as a whole. Due to the lack of an acceptable contract and timing, the Board also voted unanimously to cancel our May event.

Neohio will continue to work with Nelson in an attempt to get a contract that is agreeable to both parties for a possible future event. Neohio is also working with other tracks and Regions to coordinate an event later in 2015.

Anyone that wishes to discuss or review the contract should contact a Neohio Board member.

SCCA Neohio 2015 Hall of Fame Inductees

Congratulations to the following 2015 Neohio Region Hall of Fame Inductees and their families!

Michael Cyphert

Mike currently races his #76 Toyota in GT3 and has been a member of Neohio Region since 1978. He won two national championships in GT 3 in 2000 and 2002, and has been on the runoffs podium 6 times. Mike has a career win record of 182. He was the Great Lakes/ Central Division GT3 champion 22 times and a Neohio Region champion 34 times. In 2002, Mike won the Triple Crown Championship, the only one to do so in GT3. He has set track race records at every track he raced at from 1985 - present. Mike is a three time national points champion in GT3 in 2010, 2011 & 2012; and the Northern Conference Majors GT3 champion in 2013 and 2014.

Michael Galati

Born with racing in his blood, Michael Galati's extraordinary winning career includes five national championships in Showroom Stock B and C between 1989 - 1997 & five World Challenge Championships, three in the Touring Car series, and two in the GT Class, and more than 100 race wins. Galati has piloted racing machines for several of the most respected nameplates in racing, including Toyota, Mazda, Honda, Acura, Audi, Porsche, Mercedes, Volvo & Kia, respectively, and has stood on top of the podium at many of North America's legendary circuits, including: Mid-Ohio, Road America, Sebring, Road Atlanta, Watkins Glen, and Mosport, where he won the World Challenge race, with five different manufacturers, & the first win for Volvo & Kia. Mike was awarded the SCCA's President's Cup in 1994. & was also a winner in the Longest Day at Nelson Ledges.

Ann McHugh

Ann McHugh's contributions to SCCA and Neohio have been in several areas: as Regional Executive and other leadership positions, driver, organizing Neohio exhibits at the Cleveland Auto Show and Autorama, editing/printing/mailing the Blower, running the press room for the Runoffs at Road Atlanta and MidOhio for several years, and perhaps most memorably, chairing the Longest Day at Nelson Ledges from 1981 - 1996. The storied Longest Day is indelibly linked with Ann. She joined Neohio in 1971 and got a novice permit to race her Datsun Roadster in 1973. Injuries from a street car accident stopped her racing, but she continued to take on many organizational jobs at the races and for Neohio, including being press officer for Nelson Ledges and co-chairing the Neohio Competition Clinic. She spearheaded the project (Continued on page 6.)

to develop a reusable display for auto shows & mall shows. Ann was Regional Executive for four terms, increasing the membership from 600 to 1000, thanks to the Longest Day.

Dave Weitzenhof

Dave started racing in 1968 and has raced in Formula Vee, Formula Ford, Sports 2000, Formula Continental, and F2000 as well as co-driving other cars in IMSA, etc. He has won 7 SCCA National Championships: FV 1972; FF 1977, 1979, 1981, and 1987; and FC 1992 and 1998. He won American Formula Ford Association Professional Championships in 1977 & 1979 through 1983. Dave has over 190 career wins & 55 track records. He currently races professionally in the F2000 Championship Series. Other aspects of Dave's racing career include being the test driver for the SCCA Spec Racer (Sports Renault) in 1984 and an "at-the-track" engineer for an Indy Lights team in 1997. In 1985, he was invited to & drove in the "Formula Ford Race of Champions" at the British Grand Prix. He has also competed in invitational Formula Ford races in Venezuela. Dave was awarded the Road Racing Drivers Club (RRDC) Mark Donohue Award (outstanding performance at the SCCA Runoffs) in 1972 & the SCCA President's Cup in 1977. He was elected to full membership in the RRDC in 1978. He won the Neohio SCCA Region's Driver of the Year award three times. In 1995, he was awarded Wisconsin's (Road America) "Governor's Cup" award. Dave helps other drivers with technical assistance & his handling seminar at Neohio's Competition Clinics, NEDiv, & the SCCA National MSX conference.

Richard W. Gent*

Dick Gent's thirst for speed began shortly after World War II ended.

He bought an Elto powered midget & had fun racing it on oval tracks at Sportsman's Park in Bedford, Ohio & at the Cleveland Stadium until 1950. From midget racing on an oval track, he graduated to road racing with an 1100cc Bandini Siluro and found himself quite successful at Watkins Glen, taking 2nd place in 1951. It was that same year, 1951, that he & a few friends spearheaded the formation of the Cleveland Sports Car Club, which later proved to be instrumental in the development of the Neohio SCCA. Dick was one of three signers of Neohio Region's original charter. The 1950's were very prolific for him in racing, maintaining a prosperous manufacturing company & sharing his love of racing with his wife and three children. A Mille Miglia 202 Cisitalia became a much loved car that he raced at Watkins Glen, Elkhart Lake, Bridgehampton, & Lime Rock. From 1953-1956, Dick had the most success racing a 1100cc Motto bodied Sport at Put-In-Bay, Watkins Glen, Bridgehampton, Lock Borne, & MacDill Air Force Bases. The final two races of his career were at the Akron Sports Car Races - winning both of those races in the 1100cc Motto

bodied sport. In 1957, he became partners in acquiring a 750cc Bandini & his future son-in-law, Mel Sachs, won the National championship for them that very year.

Charles F. Irish, Jr.*

Charles Irish became involved in racing in the late 1940's, crewing for his younger brother Dick in a Siata Gran Sport, in endurance races at Vero Beach and Sebring. After being seriously injured in the Korean War, he tried driving race cars, but was limited by his loss of depth perception and his brain injury. He entered his Kieft-Norton Formula III in a few races including Brynfyn Tyddyn (in Pennsylvania) and the Akron Airport sports car race of 1954. He was one of the founders of the Cleveland Sport Car Club (CSCC), which pre-dated SCCA in Ohio by over a year. Dick Gent, Dick Irish & Charles Irish used the CSCC as a method of building membership to create Neohio Region for SCCA. Charles F. Irish, Jr. was one of three signers of Neohio Region's original charter.

SCCA Convention Ends on a High Note with the Awards and Hall of Fame Ceremony

The SCCA Awards and Hall of Fame Induction Presented by Mazda closed out the 2015 SCCA National Convention and MSX Expo held at the Charlotte Convention Center Feb. 20-21. The banquet saw the presentation of four of the Club's highest awards, in addition to the induction of the 2015 Hall of Fame class.

To start off the awards, the Member of Excellence was given to JD King. King was selected by the Board of Directors for his extensive contributions to the Club. He is most known in the Solo community, but he has plenty of experience in wheel-to-wheel racing. In 1997, King was involved in an industrial accident that caused him the loss of his left arm. However, that did not deter King from following his passion for the Club and is even an active competitor and Club Racing administrator to this day.

Andrew Pallotta took home the Solo Driver of the Year award following a performance in which he captured the National Solo Championship in Super Touring Xtreme, beating a field of over 60 drivers by more than 0.5-second. Pallotta was selected by the members of the Solo Events Board for his noteworthy performance at the Championship meet.

"I am so surprised by this that I don't know what to say," Pallotta said. "Nick [Barbato] and Darren [Seltzer] are amazing drivers, in their own right. I can't believe that I was chosen for this award over them. I have to thank everyone who has helped me along the way. There are too many to name, but without you this wouldn't have been possible."

Next up on the docket was the President's Cup, which was given to Andrew Longe. Longe was announced as the award winner by three-time President's Cup winner and motorsports legend Roger Penske in a video recorded message. This award is presented to the driver who showed the most ability, competitiveness and success at the National Championship Runoffs as selected by the Stewards of the Meet and the Chief Steward of the event. Longe's

20-lap battle with Kyle Kelley for the Touring 2 title more than qualified as the finish was decided by just 0.047-second, the second-closest Runoffs finish of the transponder era.

The final award of the night was the Woolf Barnato award, presented by last year's winner Bob Dowie. Current SCCA VP of Solo/Rally Howard Duncan was revealed as the winner, as selected by the previous three winners for his outstanding long-term contribution to the Club. A pleasantly surprised Duncan accepted the award.

"I can't believe I am up here receiving this award," Duncan said. "I figured I was going to be able to take it easy tonight since I knew I didn't have to worry about speaking. I was just planning on standing up here to direct traffic. However, this is a huge honor and I thank everyone here for this opportunity."

To finish the evening's festivities was the induction of the newest class to the SCCA Hall of Fame. Each new member was nominated by the general membership and hand-picked by the selection committee based on both on- and off-track contributions to the Club. Included in the class were Dr. George Snively, Ron Sharp, Bob Tullius, Roger Johnson and Oscar Kovaleski.

Accepting on behalf of Snively was Dr. Dan Thomas, the President of the Snell Memorial Foundation. Snively's research into head trauma was sparked by the death of William "Pete" Snell at an auto race in 1956. It was determined that Snell died because of inadequate head protection. Snively decided to further research the problem and presented his findings to the San Francisco Region SCCA. As his research gathered momentum, it eventually led to the founding of what we now know as the Snell Foundation. The organization is responsible for certifying helmets for many applications and pushes to increase the effectiveness of those safety devices.

Ron Sharp was the next inductee. He made a name for himself more as an event organizer, but also spent plenty of

time at the controls of a racecar. Among his accomplishments were the successful move of the Runoffs from Road Atlanta to Mid-Ohio and the successful production of the Des Moines Grand Prix.

"When the Des Moines Valley Region found out, in 1988, that Trans Am was planning on having a street race, our region looked at is as a real opportunity," Sharp said. "Not many regions get the opportunity to participate in something like this. As a show of support, our membership exploded from about 130 to over 400. We were able to work with many of the chiefs from the Central and Mid-West Divisions to make the event a success. We all knew that street races have their own personality, and set of problems, but with hard work from the team we were able to make the event happen."

Bob Tullius etched his name into SCCA history with many successful years behind the wheel of various cars. His Group 44 race team became one of the most fearsome organizations in SCCA Club Racing, at a time when there were not many full-fledged amateur race teams. Tullius also proved to have success in the professional ranks scoring numerous Trans Am and other professional wins.

"I thought sitting on the grid for at the Runoffs was nerve-wracking, but not to worry this is much worse," Tullius said. "My friends and supporters, many of whom are here tonight, are extremely important to not only my racing success, but my life in general. The life of a racer is a mixture of high highs and very low lows. Without good support, it makes dealing with those cycles very difficult."

Roger Johnson was the penultimate inductee during the evening. Johnson made his mark in the Solo community, most prominently as a course designer. While that is part of his legacy, Johnson also produced the materials by which new course designers learn the craft. Aside from that, Johnson has also introduced an international flair to the



The Neohio Awards Banquet for 2014, I know its 2015 already, was a great success. Meeting the Neohio Hall of Fame members was quite an honor for me. The names of Richard W. Gent and Charles F. Irish, Jr. were ones I only heard stories about. But I knew the names and their history as original signers of the Neohio Charter. The other inductees, Michael Cyphert, Michael Galati, Ann McHugh, and Dave Weitzenhof have been friends for many years and it was great to see them receive the honor of being Hall of Fame members. I will not try to name all of the award winners, as I fear I might miss someone. Just be sure to read the article elsewhere in The Blower. Thanks to Debbie LaFond, Peggy Dietz, Dr. Dan Koplow and everyone else that helped plan such a successful event.

Now this paragraph is real tough to write. By now many people have heard that the May 2-3, 2015 Neohio Double Regional has been cancelled. It's true. Briefly, after waiting for a contract from Nelson Ledges Race Complex management for several months I received one on March 1, 2015. I sent the contract to the board members for their review and it was discussed at our meeting on March 3, 2015. There were many items that we could not agree on. We would have ten days to get a new

contract acceptable to all parties and send it the Great Lakes Division Executive Steward for his approval and then get the approved document to National office for their blessing and Sanction Numbers. If we failed to get this done in ten days we would incur an additional increase in our sanction fees according to the GCR. This would already take a large bite out of any possible profit. It was at this juncture that the Neohio Board of Trustees voted unanimously to not accept the contract. After some discussion another vote was taken and it was unanimous for cancelling the event. There is a sidebar report elsewhere in the Blower so please take second to read that. And if you have any other questions, feel free to email or text me with questions.

We will be working to hold a double regional later in the year if a venue can be found that will fit into the schedule. A race at Nelson Ledges Race Complex cannot be ruled out. I am fully aware of how many drivers loved to race NLRC and considered it their "home" and favorite race track.

So as not to end on a sour note, please keep an ear out for a possible social event in the near future that would prove to be a lot of fun. Hint: For those of you that have been around a few years. "You know what really burns my butt?"
