So much to say; so little room to say it! Here we go:

SCCA Tire Rack Solo Nationals

Sure, our club has some problems, but the Solo program is not one of them. A record 1223 entries were recorded for Solo's premiere event, the Tire Rack Solo Nationals. Winners from Area 4 included: Andrew Pallotta (NeOhio), Laura Harbour (CenKy), Holly Schwedler (NWOhio), Carol Kolk (Detroit), Dave Montgomery (Cincy), Charina Jones (NWOhio), Carol Burger (Indy), and Krystal Lavender (Indy). Well done!

SCCA Runoffs

If you were not there, you missed one of the best Runoffs ever. No kidding. Daytona is a unique track where drafting plays a crucial role. This produced spectacular racing, full of strategy and skill. Area 4 racers faired quite well as we always do. But the best was the Friday night Spec Miata race under the lights: an instant classic – 63 cars, different set-ups, all drafting, where the third place and fourth place cars go sailing by the leaders on the last turn of the last lap for the Win and Place. A fireworks display immediately followed- Awesome!

All cars should have lights. A big "thank you" to Mazda for making this happen and for providing us two fun 2016 Miatas for Pace Cars (pics to the right). The 2016 Runoffs will be September 19-25 at Mid-Ohio. In 2017, the Runoffs stay in Area 4 as we will be at the Indianapolis Motor Speedway September 29-October 1. The club is looking to go back to the West Coast in 2018

RallyCross National Championship

102 Competitors took to the field (literally) August 7-9 at Indianola, Iowa for the 2015 RallyCross National Championships. Area 4 was well

represented, although we did not achieve the top step of the podium. Check out the recap in Sportscar.

Sportscar Magazine

Speaking of Sportscar, at the October BOD meeting, we received the results of a survey and consulting report from US Sports Advisors about Sportscar Magazine. For years, we have looked at Sportscar and the huge cost in our budget. But no one really understood what this cost buys us. We hired this firm to enlighten us, and they sure did. For example: 90% of our members read it every month; only 4% want a digital-only magazine. And about 10,000 of our members do not participate in any activity, but they like receiving Sportscar for their dues. We are still evaluating this very thorough report as we consider a contract renewal for Sportscar in 2016.

<u>TNIA</u>

Track Night in America (TNIA) concluded its first season. There were 89 events with 4182 participants (2862 unique participants). 68% of those were non-SCCA members. We were able to sign up 217 new members. 49% of the participants were in stock vehicles; 23% of participants were on track for the first time. More importantly, the SCCA received accolades from other sanctioning bodies for this innovative way to get enthusiasts out to the track. As they say, "a rising tide floats all ships". The more folks join the SCCA, the better for all racing organizations. Kudos to Heyward Wagner and the Topeka staff for the successful launch of this innovative program.

October BOD Meeting Other Matters

There were many other items considered by the Board at the October BOD meeting. Incidentally, we held this near the Kansas City airport to save transportation costs of getting everyone to Topeka (see we do care!). Topics included:

• Presentation by CRB Chairman Jim Wheeler; adopted 2016 CRB recommended rules. The Series Chief Steward is no more. That title changes to "Race Director" so as not to confuse him/her with the Chief Steward.

In January 2015, Race Care Ministry chose to do a six month toy drive to benefit five Ohio children's hospitals and the goal was set for 250 items. The effort was called "Ohio Smiles 4 Kids' and was patterned after a prior Ohio Valley Region's '500 Smiles' toy drive in 2005. With the blessing and support of the OVR Board and free advertising donated by some Ohio SCCA region's websites and newsletters, things started happening as early as February. The 2015 Great Lakes Race Expo at the Full Throttle Indoor Karting in Cincinnati featured Race Care Ministry for the race related charity and some funds and items started coming in. Even my co-workers at Defense Finance and Accounting Service got involved and often there are stuffed animals left at my desk for 'the kids'.

When race started, season announcements at race events helped get the word out for the need of items. Items made their way to a donation box was put out at the Saturday evening parties. Items were dropped off at the Grid or at my van in the Worker Campground. Donations were given at the Sunday morning Chapel service. Once back home from events, items were stored in airtight containers to keep them free from dust and the curiosity of my four legged roommates. By August, the pile of items grew larger and more containers were bought. By October, knowing that we'd already hit our goal, it was exciting to wonder just how much we'd surpass it. After the last event at Mid-Ohio, it was time to go shopping! A total of \$392.00 was donated. To optimize the number of items, I visited my favorite Dollar Tree and got cases of new and clean stuffed animals, books, toys, and crayons. Next it was to sort and separate out and evenly divide the items per hospital. It was a lot of work but it was fun. To see the containers pile up made it hit home – we were going to make a lot of kids smile!

Then it was time for a road trip! On Oct 13th, Kathy Gall and I dropped off the donation for the Nationwide Children's Hospital in Columbus Ohio as it was on the way to Dayton Ohio. The next day, Kathy and myself, racers JD Pfetzing, Mike Helm, Suren Tchobanian and Jerry Cabe met at the Dayton Childrens Hospital for a visit. Kathy's organizational skills got good use arranging the items in the cart so that JD, Suren and Mike could easily access them. Jerry brought his blue #10 Spec Miata for display outside the building. As Kathy and Jerry greeted people entering and leaving the hospital having them fill their names on stickers that were placed on Jerry's car, the rest of the Smile Team visited kids in their rooms. Federal law prohibits pictures being published without parental consent so if you can just imagine the faces of the kids lighting up when the guys chat with them or have them sign their names on a helmet. It is priceless! When offered a picture coloring kit, one young lady explained to Suren that she 'wasn't a girly girl' and so Suren offered her a nice race hat and poster. She was happy!

As of this writing, the toys are all purchased, sorted and boxed for delivery to the remaining three hospitals by December. Typically the hospitals will use some toys for the holidays and some will be kept to use for use during the year for birthday celebrations, prizes for game nights, etc. The grand total was 1507 items!
