Next trustee's meeting will be February 4, 2025 via Zoom at 7:30 pm.



2025 Neohio Hall of Fame Induction

To honor those who contributed to the region through their volunteer work or who brought honor to the region for their accomplishments

Neohio Region would like to thank the Hall of Fame Committee for their time, effort and selection process. Sherrie Weitzenhof, Chair, Jeff Blumenthal, Dorothy Harrington, Brenda Nick and Bob Roberts.

Our 2025 inductees are:

Martin Dodenhoff

Martin Dodenhoff, his wife Sara and his Bugeye Sprite moved to the Cleveland area shortly after the middle of the '60s.

Supporting his passion for SCCA sports car racing, he became co-founder and owner of The Winners Circle in Rocky River, Ohio in 1970. The Winners Circle became the "go to" store for racing aficionados. Martin's many victories on race tracks across the country led him to hold the course record at several tracks, including Road Atlanta. In 1967 he finished 4th at the runoffs in Daytona. 1968 brought 8 straight national wins in the CENDIV but he skipped the trip to Riverside.

By 1972 he was at the Road Atlanta runoffs and qualified on the pole but finished second to Randy Canfield. By 1977 he sold the Sprite and was driving a factory supported TR7 in which he finished 9th at Atlanta. In 1983 driving a borrowed Sprite in GP he qualified on the pole at the runoffs and again finished 2nd. He drove the same car in 1985 and finished 4th after winning the CENDIV with 6 national wins. In 8 trips to the runoffs he never finished lower than 9th. He also raced a Spridget and Lotus Europa.

Dody, as Martin was known in racing circles, also officiated at driver's schools for the NEOHIO region and helped several Sprite drivers learn to go faster. He could always be recognized at races by wearing a disreputable straw hat and talking with everybody.

2025 SCCA US Road Rally Challenge (USRRC), October 10-12, 2025

After being asked once again to seriously consider hosting the SCCA US Road Rally Challenge, Neohio Region has agreed to present three rallies over three consecutive days in October. Here are the (very preliminary) concepts for these rallies:

- 1) Friday, October 10 **Johnny Appleseed,** Canton, Ohio. Absolutely straightforward afternoon/evening TSD rally heading southeast through Ohio's Muskingum Watershed Conservancy District, and on south through the Appalachian foothills to an overnight halt in/near Marietta, Ohio. The Johnny Appleseed name is a legacy from a National Rally first hosted by Neohio Region in the 1950's. The rally has changed form over the decades, but the name endures.
- 2) Saturday, October 11 **Ohio Milk Run**, Marietta, Ohio. Absolutely straightforward TSD rally running northbound, and parallel to, but slightly west of Friday's route. The Milk Run name is an homage to an old motorcycle enduro that ran in the same area.
- 3) Sunday, October 12 **Cleveland Alley Rallye**, Cleveland, Ohio. The Alley Rallye will be a resurrection of a once hugely popular annual event organized by the now-defunct Cleveland Sport Car Club, starting in the 1950's. It is a lighthearted tour that will introduce participants to the full spectrum of Cleveland's urban landscape: the post-industrial "Flats", distinct ethnic neighborhoods, grids of narrow brick streets separating century-old warehouses, mazes of alleys and loading docks beneath theaters and office towers, and breathtaking views of the mighty Cuyahoga River (yes, THAT Cuyahoga the one that burned!).

Maurice's Neohio membership goes back to March 1979, but he was a member of SCCA while stationed at Fort Campbell, KY in 1974-1975. While there he raced his street Opel Manta in Autocross, Rally, and Road Racing - back when you raced what you drove to the track. He crewed for Paul Newman, Fred Baker, and Roger Bighouse during the early years as well.

Since joining Neohio Maurice has not only raced himself in FV, FF, FC, and IT, but crewed for many drivers over the years including his wife, daughter, and former son-in-law. His biggest mistake was putting his wife and daughter on the race track at the same time, there is still discussion as to who hit who! He has rented out his Honda race cars over the years to approximately 15 drivers to get their competition license.

He started out as a Tech Inspector after having a "non-compliant" part in his Ford Fiesta and Barry Kaplan said that if he came back to the track he had to plan on working Tech. Maurice thought it was a joke but it was not. This started a long term friendship which eventually led to him becoming the Chief of Tech for Neohio for the last 25 years. He will often go to driver's homes or businesses to do annual tech inspections on racecars and help with new car builds to make sure that competitors are on the right track with their racing dreams. He helped with the development of Safety Day training, working with others to build the "Flipover" car to demonstrate extrication process for F&C and Safety personnel.

He has also worked F&C on various occasions when the need arose for extra help, especially during the 24 hour races.

In the last few years he started in the Stewards program and had his first time as Chief Steward this past October.

He also was instrumental with the Neohio Annual Tech Days and Competition Clinic. At the Clinic he helped with the building of a SM and issuing the annual tech, as well as teaching attendees about how to get involved in SCCA racing.

Maurice is the type of person that very seldom says no to anyone when it comes to helping with their racing and has even taken parts off his own car to help them. He has also been the recipient of Neohio's Elden "Dutch" Moore Award, Bill Benham Award, and Trustee's Award (several times).

Do you worry about your teenage driver or know someone who does?
