As Fall approaches, we have a lot going on here in NEOHIO Region, SCCA!

Registration is now open for our **Jim Pracker and John Hinkle Memorial Races** at Nelson Ledges the weekend of September 13-14th. **Jim Pracker** was a racer and tireless volunteer who helped our region in many ways, including stints as Trustee, Regional Executive and Chief of Emergency Services. Jim also provided a lot of two-way radio support for our region and Nelson Ledges. **John Hinkle** was one of the original "track brats", having grown up at the track while his parents, Woody and Suzy, were serving as volunteers in F&C. John grew up to serve in many roles in the region including racer, rally driver and/or navigator, autocrosser, crew chief and volunteering in F&C, as a Rally Master and as Chair of a couple of Solo events.

The weather should be fantastic the second weekend of September. In addition to the traditional Divisional Race classes there is an optional Pursuit Race on Saturday afternoon. Call to Order: The Zoom meeting was called to order by R.E. Bob MacDonald at 7:36pm.

Review of Prior Minutes: Minutes from the June 3, 2025 Zoom meeting were emailed to the Board by Ray Glover for review prior to the meeting. A motion to accept the minutes as corrected was made by Brenda Nick, seconded by Bill Crowe, and approved without objection.

Treasurer's Report: Joe Blaha emailed his July Treasurer's Report to the Board prior the meeting and reported the following. The cash balance is up from last month and down a little from last year. A motion to approve the July Treasurer's Report was made by Tom Wieland, seconded by Ashley Medwig, and approved without objection.

Membership: Bill Snow emailed the following report:

Regional Executive Report: Bob MacDonald reported the following:

Solo: Jonathan Staggs reported the following:

Two events were held in June, one at Eastlake and one at the IX Center, both went well.

Made an emergency purchase of a new generator as the old one died.

The July National Solo event was cancelled by national. We will hold a one day local event on the 12th.

Bill Crowe moved to approve the purchase of the new generator as well as parts to fix the old one (if fixable) with a budget of \$750, seconded by Tom Wieland, and approved without objection.

Time Trial and Road Racing: Dave Lancaster reported the following:

Bill Snow noted that National has updated their social media postings to a couple of time a week.

Social Events: Bill Crowe and Bill Snow reported the following:

The August 14th event at the Crawford Museum is only six weeks away. Bob MacDonald has all the contacts so he will take care of promoting the event. Duane Harrington suggested attending in your SCCA gear to promote the region.

Awards Celebration: Bob Roberts reported the following:

Taylor Allen moved to approve a budget or \$1,200 for the Awards Celebration, seconded by Tom Wieland, and approved without objection.

Notes from the Director's Chair Area 4 Director Update August 2025

I will be very busy in August. I'll visit the OVR Double Regional at MidOhio as well as be the Pace Car driver for two events at Grattan later in the month. Throw in that we will be moving my 86 year old Mother to be closer to us and it'll be a trying month all around.

I also have a couple of announcements to make. After consultation with my BoD colleagues, I have decided to accept their offer and assume the role of Club Racing Board (CRB) Chair permanently. I was installed back in January on an interim basis. Since then, I have enjoyed the role a lot more than I had expected. Making this announcement adds clarity to the Club Racing program at a time of flux as we conclude the 2025 season and prepare for the 2026 season.

As I know I cannot effectively occupy both roles at the same time, I will resign my position as Area 4 Director on 12/31/25. I have informed the BoD Chair (Bob Crawford) of these decisions. This timeline will allow the Board to find a successor and have a seamless transition. I will continue to serve as your Director for the remainder of the year so please reach out to me if you have any issues that you think need my attention.

Here's what I did since my last report.....

Video Conference Meetings:

Club Racing Board (CRB) (7/1): We discussed a variety of data acquisition issues (Runoffs plans, cars that were difficult to collect data, long term plans, etc.). The group continued to focus on the face to face meeting which would be held at the end of the month in Kansas City (see below). We worked on the agenda and logistics (getting folks to and from the airport to our downtown hotel). We discussed some balance of performance (BoP) in the Prototype class. We added some motors to the GT2 class as well. The results of all of the CRB rules changes can be seen here.

Electrified Vehicle Advisory Committee (EVAC) (7/9): We reviewed EV safety information that will be added as modules to the Solo Safety Steward and RallyX Safety Steward refresher training courses. We also began the process of creating an Emergency Resource Guide (ERG) template for bespoke cars that would compete in SCCA events. This would allow builders to have an easy to follow plan when creating the ERG for their racecar. ERGs are created by manufacturers so customers have information about all sorts of features that might need to be highlighted should someone tow or work on that

sorts of features that might need to be highlighted should someone tow or work on that particular vehicle.

Production Advisory Committee (PAC) (7/22): As I had not sat in on an advisory committee (AC) meeting before, I thought I would join to understand how they operate. There are several ACs that report to the CRB. Each one has a category or class that it oversees. As a long time, production car racer, I thought this would be a good place to start as I had experience in the category and knew most of the members of the AC.

Board of Directors (7/28): As we met face to face last week (see below), we did not have our regularly scheduled monthly Zoom meeting.

SCCA Events:

CRB Meeting (7/24, 7/25): We held a two-day meeting in Kansas City. We met all day on 7/24 and used the morning of 7/25 to finish things up. I was bouncing back and forth between meetings on 7/25 as the BoD held it meeting at the same time.

We discussed a variety of things. How would be handle data collection? Both short term after the retirement of Glen Thielke and long term. Would we be able to effectively collect data from all classes so good BoP could be incorporated? We discussed the "Open Letter" that I wrote to the drivers corps asking for more involvement. Sydney Davis Yagel had sent out a survey to 7300 drivers and we examined those responses for guidance on program policy. We reviewed the license structure for Club Racing as well as Race Experience programs and how they could tie together. We discussed the driver's school requirements so each new driver would be armed with the same information when entering their first SCCA event.

BoD meeting (7/25, 7/26): Like the CRB, we held a two-day meeting in Kansas City. This was two whole days as we had a very full agenda on our hands. It also included some team building exercises since we were in downtown KC and not isolated way out at the airport.

Like the CRB meeting, we had a wide variety of topics on our plate. In no particular order, here are a few of the topics discussed.

We heard from our lawyers about various cases the cub is involved with currently.

A steady, yearlong reduction in entries across all of our programs had led to a lower than expected (budgeted) revenue from event sanction fees. Budgets have been revised, and we should be able to catch up by the end of the year.

Our new IT guy (Kevn Dayo) reported about several ways he has increased security on our systems. To this computer illiterate layman, all of this sounded like science fiction, but it has been quite effective. He has been a great addition to the national office staff.

2025 SCCA US Road Rally Challenge (USRRC), October 10-12, 2025

Plans for the 2025 SCCA US Road Rally Challenge, hosted by Neohio Region, are starting to solidify. Here is some information about the three rallies:

- 1) Friday, October 10 **Johnny Appleseed Rally** (JAR), Canton, Ohio. Absolutely straightforward afternoon/evening TSD rally winding southeast through Ohio's Muskingum Watershed Conservancy District (MWCD), then south through the Appalachian foothills, to an overnight halt in Marietta, Ohio. Columnar "tulip" style route instructions (similar to a stage rally routebook) will be used. To help those with limited previous timekeeping experience stay on schedule, parenthetical perfect cumulative times will be provided for nearly all instructions. The Johnny Appleseed name is a legacy from a National Rally first hosted by Neohio Region in the 1950's. The rally has changed form over the intervening decades, but the name endures. Rallymaster: Greg Lester. Registration is open, and more information can be found here: msreg.com/JAR25
- 2) Saturday, October 11 Ohio Milk Run (OMR), Marietta, Ohio. Another absolutely straightforward TSD rally running northbound, and parallel to, but slightly west of Friday's route. The Milk Run name is an homage to an old motorcycle enduro that ran in the same area. Rallymaster: Ron Johnstonbaugh. Registration is open, and more information can be found here: msreg.com/OMR25
- 3) Sunday, October 12 Cleveland Alley Rallye, Cleveland, Ohio. The Alley Rallye will be a resurrection of a once hugely popular annual event organized by the now-defunct Cleveland Sport Car Club, starting in the 1950's. It is a lighthearted jaunt that will introduce participants to the full spectrum of Cleveland's urban landscape: the post-industrial "Flats", distinct ethnic neighborhoods, grids of narrow brick streets separating century-old warehouses, mazes of alleys and loading docks beneath theaters and office towers, and numerous breathtaking views of the mighty Cuyahoga River (yes, THAT Cuyahoga the one that burned!). Timekeeping equipment will be restricted to pop stock odometer and a basic four function non-programmable calculator (i.e. all teams will run at equal disadvantage.). Proceeds from this rally will be donated to Slow Roll Cleveland (www.slowrollcleveland.org), a 501(c)3 charity that promotes community engagement through inclusive social bike rides. Rallymaster: Jeff Arendas. Registration is open, and more information can be found here: msreg.com/CLE25

The Richta automated timing system will be used for all 3 rallies.

Competitors of all experience levels are encouraged to enter these rallies.

Eric Jones Memorial Riverrun, August 30, 2025:

Riverrun is an annual all-day driving tour over wonderful roads in southern Ohio. All proceeds from the event will be donated to a Mesothelioma research charity in memory of longtime Columbus, Ohio area rallyist, and British car service/restoration business proprietor Eric Jones.


